On this mosaic coming from Germany we can observe the linear and curved meanders

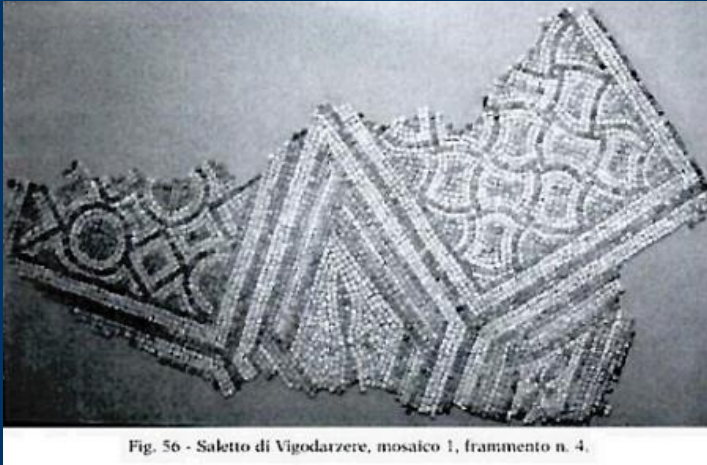
Knot of Solomon.
